WHAT?

Teaching GERMAN for 12-16 hours per week. With preparation, marking or any other appropriate projects weekly workload should not exceed 36 hours per week.

WHEN?

Placement period: September to March/April.

HOW?

Co-funded by (1) the European Commission's ERASMUS+ scheme from the GETs' home university and (2) a monthly grant of GBP 350 by the receiving local council GETs are selected and trained by Johannes Gutenberg University of Mainz and supported by the University of Edinburgh.
