

# Survey Findings: Key Takeaways











### Survey Bases

- 436 responses to national survey
  - Local authorities across Scotland, from Shetland to Scottish Borders and Glasgow to Edinburgh.
  - Age range: P5 S4 (36% in S1)
- Sample of 5 Scottish students learning French at University of Edinburgh
  - From state schools in a range of local authorities
  - Age range: 1st 4th year
- ENQUÊTE INTERNATIONALE SUR LA PERCEPTION DE LA LANGUE FRANÇAISE - IPSOS pour l'Institut Français, September 2024
  - 24450 respondents (18+), not necessarily learners of French
  - 12 countries

# National Survey

They don't hate French!



It's fascinating

I like learning about the culture

It's not easy but I like it

- 7 They want to do more talking
  - It's the area that they say the enjoy the most
  - It's the area that they find least difficult
  - They want to be able to 'have normal conversations in French with people'
- They want culture to be a key part of lessons

## Student Sampling

- They would have appreciated more varied input in primary school
- They would have liked to do more talking and to hear the language used in class more

They really enjoyed authentic cultural content whenever they had the opportunity
