#### **Update from Scottish Government – Toria Fraser**

- There is funding for session 2016/17
- Proposals for funding are with the Cabinet Secretary
- Hope to reach conclusion shortly
- The spending review will set funds for 3 years
- SCILT to get the same funding for session 2016/17 as last session

#### **Update from Education Scotland – Louise Glen**

- Materials have been migrated to the National Improvement Hub
- 2 new resources: Astérix and Copernicus
- Coming soon Progression guidance and support from First to Second level in Modern Languages
- Assessing Progress and Achievement also updated and linked to First Level E's & O's

#### **Update from SCILT – Fhiona Fisher**

- New Professional Learning Menus from SCILT and CISS have been launched with a focus on Leadership and Sustainability, Developing the Young Workforce, Transition and L3 in the Secondary sector. Contact them ASAP if you would like to organise some CLPL.

# 5. Keynote: Feedback from ADES 1 & 2 report – Bruce Robertson (ADES) and Fiona O'Hanlon (University of Edinburgh)

#### **Key findings: Positives**

- High degree of importance has been given to 1 & 2 nationally / across LAs
- Overwhelmingly positive aspect of BGE
- LA 1 & 2 Co-ordinators are crucial to the development of the policy
- 1 & 2 aligned with principles of CfE
- On the whole, LAs felt confident for a 2020 implementation

#### **Areas for concern:**

- Progression and continuity within BGE
- Capacity of primary teachers to deliver L2 in Upper Primary (there may be a need to look at models of delivery in the future)
- Engagement of Secondary Schools with 1 & 2
- Concern about the provision of training for 1 & 2 in the longer term (where does this fall within ITE programmes? What type of training is most appropriate?)
- Place / priority of 1 & 2 amongst other government priorities
- Rationale for L3 and clarification of expected provision
- Place of home / community languages and the link with EAL
- Evaluation of outcomes and the quality of teaching and learning
- Potential for inter-authority and cross-sector collaboration

General discussion then took place including issues surrounding sustainability, austerity, sharing of resources and ITE.
