- Issues with implementation of 2015 Scots policy
- SQA: steadily increasing numbers in uptake of Scottish studies and Scots language awards
- ES: Scots most popular L3
- European Council report 2020: lack of opportunities to study Scots in education
- Scots CPG: reconvened, regular meetings on education
- ITE: students' interest in Scots significant shift in educational practice

 - Show Scots as a key literacy skill, including writing
 - Building new relationships across curricular areas

 - all in-service teachers in Scotland regardless of level, subject area, existing skills in Scots
- Content:
 - not about Scots language but it's educational benefits and how to maximise these
 - Part of a suite of resources, including <u>Scots language and culture</u> <u>open course</u> (over 40,000 students to date)
