## Option 1

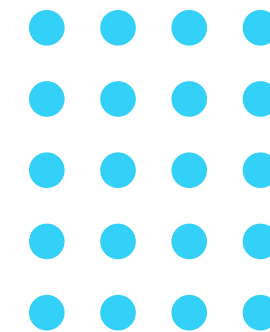
