

- Oct 2023- Pilot curriculum review begins. Event for all secondary ML teachers. 70 attendees.
- Follow up online sessions Nov and Dec 2023
- Materials shared at LANGs and other stakeholder groups invited to contribute Microsoft form.
- March 2024 PT focus group meets in Glasgow 29 out of 32 local authorities represented.
- Dec 2024 PT focus group reconvenes in Dundee.
- January 2025- ML formally joins CIC. ES Associates appointed










Holistic review of Scotland's Curriculum once every 10 years -







The timeline



Contexts for Learning (including Curriculum Areas): Proposed Timeline The following proposals will be reviewed after six months:

• Analysing, Engaging and co-creation of revised technical framework by **June 2025**. This will include consideration of, and alignment with, the wider skills landscape.

Analysing, Engaging and co-creation from initial exploration into core competencies by June 2025.

 Analysing, Engaging and co-creation of revised Maths and Numeracy, Literacy and English, Literacy and Gàidhlig, Health and Wellbeing and Science curriculum frameworks between April 2024 – June 2026. Sharing, learning and adopting from August 2026.

 Analysing, Engaging and co-creation of the context for learning: Life and Ethos of the School; Recognising Personal Achievement; and Interdisciplinary Learning between April 2024 – June 2026.

 Evidence gathering for Analysing stage for the remaining curricular areas: Languages; Expressive Arts; Technologies; Social Studies and Religious & Moral Education begins during 2024/2025.
