| <u>Let's get cooking</u> | 1 hour + preparation and planning | At the supermarket, look for products in other languages and from other countries. Where do your favourite foods come from? Have some fun in the kitchen and create a dish from another country. Watch the French version of Bake Off on You tube: <u>le Meilleur Pâtissier</u> |
| Movie night | 2-3 hours | Get the popcorn at the ready! Why not watch a film or tv programme in a foreign language? Many can be found on streaming channels such as Netflix. There are also lots of foreign language YouTubers for all ages and the speed/subtitles can be changed to suit learners. |
| Let's read | Over several days or weeks | Why not explore books in other languages? Have a browse through <u>The International</u> <u>Children's Digital Library</u> , <u>Clobal Storybooks</u> , <u>MagicBlox</u> or <u>Children's' Books Online</u> where you will find a wealth of reading materials. in different languages at different levels. |
| It's good to talk! | Languages Week Scotland | Share your child's language learning in family life and in everyday situations. For Languages Week try to practise familiar phrases in the language your child is learning at school. |
| Language learning together with Duolingo | Over several days or weeks | This activity can be completed as a family where all family members learn a language together. It's free to sign up and easy to use. A simple chart to record the scores for all participants will need to be prepared. Have fun! |

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| Suitable for all ages and stages <u>Learn a tongue</u> <u>twister</u> | 5 mins | Have fun with tongue twisters in different languages. Saying tongue twisters can be difficult at first, so don't worry if you can't do it very well to begin with. Just keep practising and have fun! |
| Scavenger hunt | 1 hour+ | Give your children a list of items to find. The items must be in the other language. Use an online dictionary to help source the words e.g. <u>www.wordreference.com</u> . Once you have the list, give the children a set time to find the items in the house. They might need some help with using the online dictionary. |
| Make a zine | Ongoing | Languages are all around us and there are many words used in English that are borrowed from elsewhere e.g pizza or criossant. This activity allows you to look for words from various languages and record them in your zine. Food packaging is a great source of vocabulary, as are store magazines, signs or even just noting some of your favourite words in a different language. You'll be amazed at what you will find. |
| Suitable for upper primary Social media | Over several days or weeks | Connect with your family's favourite European sportsperson or team on social media. Follow the sporting action on Facebook or tweet messages of support to your team and learn at the same time. |

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| Technology to help you learn | Over several days or weeks | Switch the settings on a mobile phone, games console or mobile device to the language your child is learning. Which words do you know? Can you guess some of the others? Ask questions to the digital voice assistant (Siri/Google) in another language. |
| Change your listening habits | Over several days or weeks | <u>Listen to favourite Disney songs in different</u> <u>languages</u> . <u>Listen to the best current European music</u> <u>on Youtube</u> . |
| Word map | 1 hour | This is an association game that you can play with your child or children. Start by writing a word in any language in the middle of a sheet of paper. Then branch out with words in the different languages they know that they associate with it. Once they are finished, they can create a multilingual story using some of the words they have shared. |
| Over several Learning together weeks or months | | If you want to continue learning a language, there are lots of free online resources to get you started such as <u>BBC Languages</u> , <u>Radio</u> <u>Lingua free podcasts</u> or <u>Duolingo</u> . |
