Strathclyde Masters in Educational Studies

These classes contribute to the Strathclyde M.Ed., which requires a total of 180 credits. The part-time programme lasts three years and students are expected to gain 60 credits per year.

Year One

You will undertake three classes each worth 20 credits, normally one class per semester.

Year Two

You will undertake three classes worth 20 credits. This will usually consist of two optional classes and a compulsory module, *Research Methods and Reasoning*. The compulsory module equips you with the necessary basis for undertaking a dissertation at Masters level.

Year Three

You'll carry out a research dissertation in a subject area of your choice worth 60 credits. We allocate a supervisor for one-to-one support while you carry out the research and report on the findings in your dissertation. We endeavour to match you with the best fit for your specialism.

You can complete your final dissertation by distance learning. This provides our students with the flexibility to complete studies around work commitments.
