






An Dà Ròs – What's the Story?

- A joint commission
- Language learning alongside social outcomes
- Let's read the story!



- Social outcomes
- Tolerance, friendship, kindness
- Cultural differences
- Very soft touch approach to difficult conversations
- Relatable for very young pupils













An Dà Ròs

Language points:

- Fluent speakers:
 - Soft introduction to the genitive
 - Conditional
 - Idioms and idiomatic structures
- Learners:
 - Nouns places, foods
 - Idioms
 - Pronunciation













An Dà Ròs

Pedagogy:

- Have the vocabulary you want the learners to acquire clear in your own mind before you start
- Highlight these words as you go through the lesson
- Take time to discuss new vocabulary and build links to previous knowledge
- Give pupils the chance to use new words during the lesson
- Highlight the new words as part of the lesson plenary
- Revisit these words in another lesson to reinforce teaching and learning
- Language acquisition is an ongoing process, grab every learning opportunity!






